Dr. Turgut is an Assistant Professor specializing in the history of religions, focusing on the Syriac (Assyrian/Aramean/Chaldean) diaspora. He is affiliated with the Department of Syriac Language and Literature at Mardin Artuklu University. He is actively engaged in postdoctoral research investigating the Assyrian community in Chicago. Additionally, Dr. Turgut is the Managing Editor of the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) in Turkey.

July 19: Panel: "How to build your credit?" Our successful realtor member and friend, Biakhal Alkhalifa, organized an amazing event with her distinguished guests, Kelly Stone and Russ Siegel, at the Kurdish Cultural Center of Illinois.

July 23: Appeal to the International community on behalf of Kurdish people - The Treaty of Lausanne, signed a century ago between Turkey, the British Empire, and France, is considered a pivotal international precedent for forced population transfers in the 20th century. It cleared Turkey from ethnic cleansing but enabled genocidal acts against Kurds and other minorities. Kurds have never accepted the treaty, as it denied their national recognition and divided Kurdistan among oppressive countries. The international community has not corrected this mistake or prevented atrocities against Kurds and other minorities. On its 100th anniversary, Kurds worldwide appeal to reverse this institutionalized treaty and establish a safe Kurdistan for all oppressed minorities in the region.
